Discernment Team Update

On Monday, March 27 the Rio Texas District superintendent Rev. Dr, Marcus Freeman facilitated our required second Listening Session. A total of 54 attendees. Several people spoke: FUMCE Leadership Council chair Cindy Powell, Lay Leader Chuck Wilkinson, Keith Joesel, UMC Director of Creating/Vitalizing Congregations & Developing Leaders Karan Horan. Followed by a question-and-answer session. The video of this session will be posted onto the FUMC-Elgin website.

The Discernment Team continues gathering the documents and information the Rio Texas Conference requires— in the event the First UMC of Elgin votes to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church. The scanning into electronic format (PDF) of our original membership records (1889-1986) is almost complete. The Articles of Incorporation, the Directors and Officers of the corporation, the 501(c)3 status, and the church insurance coverage, have been reviewed. The impact leaving the UMC would have on FUMC-Elgin, the Elgin community, and the Rio Texas Conference are being evaluated. Affiliating with another denomination is also being researched. Presentations regarding the history of the issue, the legal/property deeds, and financial aspects that would need to be handled, have been presented during the 11 am worship in the Information Moment. Handouts with the same information are available at each entry of the Sanctuary or the church office.

The team meets every Thursday at 7:30 p.m. in the church office. If you have any questions, please contact Pastor Waddle, Cody Douglas (SPRC Chair), or Chuck Wilkinson (Lay Leader).

The Leadership Council approved the formation of the Discernment Team in January. The Team is charged to research, review, discern, and most importantly perform steps set out by United Methodist governing body necessary to arrive at a point where a vote can be conducted to determine if disaffiliation is chosen or not.
